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
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
Happy Birthday, Dr. Seuss!


March is National Reading Month!





Also, please look for sign-up sheets: we need *Special Readers* to come in and share their favorite story books with the children. Won't you please read to us?








Last call for year-end statements

There is a yellow sign-up sheet on the desk in the office. If you need a statement, please fill out the requested information. You'll get your statement within a few days.




Girl Scout cookies on sale in office;
